Health Care Needs Policy

PURPOSE

To ensure that Moonee Ponds West Primary School provides appropriate support to students with health care needs.

SCOPE

This policy applies to:

- all staff, including casual relief staff and volunteers
- all students who have been diagnosed with a health care need that may require support, monitoring, or medication at school.

POLICY IMPLEMENTATION

This policy should be read with Moonee Ponds West Primary School's *First Aid, Administration of Medication, Anaphylaxis, and Asthma* policies.

Student health support planning

To provide appropriate support to students at Moonee Ponds West Primary who may need medical care or assistance, the Student Welfare Coordinator or First Aid Coordinator will prepare a Student Health Support Plan, in consultation with the student, their parents/carers, and treating medical practitioners.

Student Health Support plans help our school to assist students with:

- routine health care support needs, such as supervision or provision of medication
- personal care support needs, such as assistance with personal hygiene, continence care, eating and drinking, transfers and positioning, and use of health-related equipment
- emergency care needs, such as predictable emergency first aid associated with asthma, seizure, or diabetes management

Students with complex medical care needs, for example, tracheostomy care, seizure management or tube feeding, must have a Student Health Support Plan which provides for appropriate staff to undertake specific training to meet the student's particular needs.

At enrolment or when a health care need is identified, parents/carers should provide accurate information about the student's condition or health care needs, ideally documented by the

student's treating medical/health care practitioner on a Medical Advice Form (or relevant equivalent).

Moonee Ponds West Primary School may invite parents/carers to attend a Student Support Group meeting to discuss the contents of a student's Health Support Plan and assistance that the student may need at school or during school activities.

Where necessary, Moonee Ponds West Primary School may also request consent from parents/carers to consult with a student's medical practitioners, to assist in preparing the plan and ensure that appropriate school staff understand the student's needs.

Student Health Support Plans will be reviewed:

- when updated information is received from the student's medical practitioner
- when the school, student or parents/carers have concerns with the support being provided to the student
- if there are changes to the support being provided to the student, or
- on an annual basis.

Management of confidential medical information

Confidential medical information provided to Moonee Ponds West Primary School to support a student will be:

- recorded on the student's file
- shared with all relevant staff so that they can properly support students diagnosed with medical conditions and respond appropriately if necessary

COMMUNICATION

This policy will be communicated to our school community in the following ways:

- Included in staff induction process and staff training
- Available publicly on our school's website
- Included in staff handbook/manual
- Discussed at staff briefings/meetings as required
- Discussed at parent information nights/sessions
- Reminders in our school newsletter
- Hard copy available from school administration upon request
