Dear Parents/Carers,

Year Level 5 & 6

Moonee Ponds West Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of the parent payment arrangements for 2021.

Moonee Ponds West Primary School (MPWPS) makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents. Parents are encouraged to familiarise themselves with the Department of Education and Training (DET) Parent Payment Policy (www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/parent-payment/policy) and the MPWPS Parent Payment Arrangements @ <https://www.mooneewestps.vic.edu.au/page/241/Policies-and-Forms>

Attached in the coming pages is the fee schedule for 2021. The parent payment form includes the following charges:

1. Essential Student Learning items

These are items, activities or services that MPWPS deems **essential** to student learning of the standard curriculum. These items include:

- Items the student takes possession of (i.e. stationery (including paper), class resources).
- Activities associated with instruction that all students are expected to attend (i.e. Physical Education, Japanese, Creative Arts (Performing & Visual), Science, etc.).

2. Optional items

These are items, activities or services that are optional and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum. Students may access these on a user-pay basis.

These may be either:

- Items the student purchases or hires (i.e. Moonee Vale Instrumental Music Program (MVIMP), etc)
- Activities the student purchases (i.e. excursions, incursions, camps)

3. Voluntary Financial Contributions

These are for those items and services that parents and carers are **invited** to make a contribution to the school. Examples of these include the Building Fund and Library Fund. Voluntary Financial Contributions are reviewed annually by School Council in line with the approval of the Parent Payment Arrangements and may change based on the strategic and operational requirements of the school.

General Subject Contribution

This contribution will assist with the costs of important programs including classroom consumables used daily to support our student learning. Your contributions will assist with the purchase of classroom materials, class sets and school equipment – e.g. home reading books, class book sets, maths resources, stationery such as class scissors, printing paper, and sports equipment.

Information, Communication and Technology (ICT) Contribution

This voluntary contribution will greatly assist with the purchase and maintenance of Information, Communication and Technology (ICT) hardware and software used by students in the classroom. This includes notetbooks, iPads and network devices.

Library Fund - Tax Deductable

Funds donated for the Library Fund will be used to replace and supplement the school and classroom library books. It will also be utilised to improve the library space for all students and teachers to use. Our Library is an essential part of our school and is well resourced, each year many books from the library and classroom borrowing books become damaged and need to be replaced.

Building Fund

This fund is also tax deductible.

Funds donated for the Building Fund will go to improvements highlighted by the School Council Resource committee. This can include floor coverings, painting, signage and other building improvements.

Working Bee

This voluntary contribution has been created in lieu of attendance at a working bee. There will be two working bees in 2021. Dates to be confirmed.

Your child will not be disadvantaged if you do not make a voluntary contribution. All records of voluntary contributions are kept confidential as well as your decision about whether to make a contribution or not. All contributions are greatly appreciated and support the teaching and learning at MPWPS.

Financial Support for Families

Moonee Ponds West Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) - Parents holding a valid means-tested concession card will be eligible to apply. A special consideration category will also exist. Eligible families will need to apply for the CSEF at the school office with applications to be entered by school administrators onto a web-based system. A payment of \$125 for primary school students (\$225 for secondary school students) will be paid directly to the school to be used towards camps, sports and excursion costs for the benefit of the student.

The school will offer a three step payment plan to make it easier for families to make the payments. Alternatively there is a due date highlighted for all payments to be finalised if paying the total amount in full. Our goal is to highlight all the costs for your child's education for the year (for the relevant year level). This will allow you to plan for costs in advance.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW

The following is a summary of the main principles of the Parent Payments Policy:



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements as outlined in the Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

- Schools do not ask parents to pay for school operating costs (e.g. utility costs) or general and unspecified charges.
- Schools request payments from parents under three categories:

Essential Student Learning Items

- Items and activities which the school deems essential for student learning.
- Parents may choose to purchase essential items through the school or provide their own.

Optional Items

- Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.
- These are provided to students on a user-pays basis.

Voluntary Contributions

- Voluntary contributions support the school to continue to be the best local school for all students and can be for general or specific purpose.
- Students will not be disadvantaged in any way if parents do not make a contribution.



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and upload their arrangements on their school's public website for transparency.
